(Dec. 17, 1990)

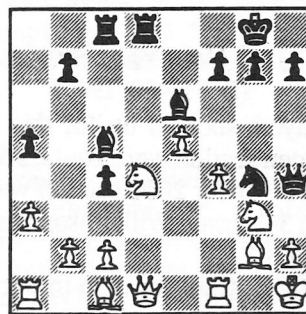
